#### The Biosecurity Act covers

The legal basis for excluding, eradicating and effectively managing pests and unwanted organisms, and its powers can be variously used by MPI, other government agencies, regional councils and pest management agencies. It is an enabling tool that provides a range of functions, powers and options for the management of risk organisms;

#### The Animal Products Act covers:

The Act covers all animal material and animal products.<sup>1</sup>

Animal material means any live or dead animal, or tissue or other material taken from any mammal, bird, finfish, shellfish, reptile, amphibian, insect or invertebrate intended for human or animal consumption (e.g. petfood) or other purposes.

The risk management system potentially covers all animal material along the production and processing chain from source to the domestic market or export.

#### The ACVM Act covers:

The ACVM Act controls the agricultural compounds and veterinary medicines used in association with animals and plants. The ACVM Act regulates the import, manufacture, sale and use of agricultural compounds and veterinary medicines to ensure compliance with domestic food residue standards through, for example, directions on labels. It also manages risks to public health, trade in primary produce, animal welfare and agricultural security.

#### Part 3: Importation of Risk Goods<sup>1</sup>

The purpose of this Part is to provide for the effective management of risks associated with imported risk goods using import health standards:

- Import Health Standards (IHS)
- Meaning and general requirements for IHS

#### Part 2 – Risk Management Programmes (RMPs)

An RMP is a programme designed to identify, control, manage, eliminate or minimise hazards and other risks during processing of animal material & products. Requirements issued under Part 2 and guidance cover the following information:

- RMP Manual
- Codes of Practice (COP) and RMP templates

#### Part 3 - Regulated Control Schemes (RCS)

RCSs are special regulatory regimes to provide for cases where it is inappropriate or impractical to manage risk factors under an RMP or where special provision is required for the purposes of overseas market access requirements. There are RCS covering the following areas:

- Contaminant monitoring and surveillance
- Hormonal growth promotant
- Transport

#### Part 5 – Export of Animal Material and Products

The purpose of this Part is to facilitate export by providing for the specifying of requirements that must be met for products to be eligible for export; providing for requirements and systems intended to safeguard official assurances and providing for the registration of exporters. Requirements issued under Part 5 and guidance covers the following information:

- General export requirements
- Export requirements for branding, marking and security devices
- Obtaining, issuing and controlling official assurances
- Export Verification
- Export Requirements (OMARs)

#### Part 8 – Recognised Agencies and Persons

The purpose of this Part is to provide for the recognition of agencies and persons to perform specialist functions and activities including verification under the Act.
