6.	Description of content: Araucaria schedule was amended to include conditions for Xf, which only applies to Broussonetia genus. Other host plant genera (Hakea, Sassafras, Stewartia, Swainsona, and Talinum) laid under conditions of Hebe Schedule, which has already appropriate measures against Xf on plants for planting pathways.

8.	Nature of the urgent problem(s) and reason for urgent action:
	The European Food Safety Authority (EFSA) has recently updated list of host plants found to be susceptible to <i>Xylella fastidiosa</i> . Among the new hosts, there are six new host plants that are not appropriately managed under the current Import Health Standard 155.02.06: Importation of Nursery Stock (the IHS). New host plants are: <i>Broussonetia</i> , <i>Hakea</i> , <i>Sassafras</i> , <i>Stewartia</i> , <i>Swainsona</i> , and <i>Talinum</i> .
